

MORE MEN ARE WANTED FOR HIS MAJESTY'S ARMY

WHO MAY ENLIST.

All men who are fit, free, and of legal age, and who are not in any other service, are eligible to enlist.

TERMS OF ENLISTMENT.

The man may enlist for the period of the War only or for the full term to which he is appointed, subject to the provisions of the Military Act, 1916. There is no limit to the War period, and the man may be called to return to any other military employment.

PAY.

Enlisting men are paid the lowest rate of pay to be in a rank, less all the Enlistment Fund, Clothing, Lodging and Medical Allowances provided for.

SEPARATION ALLOWANCES.

During the War the Government, by the payment of Separation Allowances, helps the soldier or seaman by only children, or dependents. The allowances are the family rate for the wife and children at a given station, including the minimum weekly amount that the wife receives.

PENSIONS for the DISABLED.

Men entitled to pensions will be entitled to the same rate of pay as if they were in the Army, and the amount of the pension will be the same as if they were in the Army.

PROVISION for WIDOWS and CHILDREN.
